REGULAR MEETING MINUTES March 8, 2011

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen was held in council chambers, 37 N. Sussex Street, Dover, New Jersey.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Dodd at 7:09 pm

ROLL CALL

Present: Aldermen Poolas, Visioli, Picciallo, Timpani, Romaine, Blackman, Downs and Mayor Dodd Absent: Alderman Delaney

Also present were Administrator Close, Attorney Pennella and Clerk Verga

Clerk Verga stated adequate notice was given to the official newspaper.

Mayor Dodd opened this portion of the meeting to the public for agenda items only.

Seeing no hands or hearing no voices, Mayor Dodd closed the meeting to the public.

MAYOR'S REPORT - The following comments were made by Mayor Dodd

- Meetings continue with representatives from the Department of Transportation regarding the Route 46/Route 15 Project.
- Mayor Dodd sat on the panel for "New Jersey Future" a redevelopment forum. He noted that Dover was recognized as a leader in redevelopment. The forum focused on the landfill redevelopment project which is now the location of the Fed Ex Distribution Facility, Hilton Homewood Suites and the future home of a 60,000 sq. office building.
- He was in contact with the Office of Emergency Management (OEM), this past weekend, concerning the flooding in town and commended OEM, Department of Public Works, Police and Fire Departments.
- Jersey Central Power and Light (JCP&L) will start tree trimming on the following streets starting next week. Chrystal, Knickerbocker, Liberty, Prospect, Windsor and Reservoir.
- NJ Natural Gas project continues on Route 15 and Richboynton Road, they will tunnel underneath from Dover to Wharton. The project is expected to be completed by March 18th, weather permitting.
- Finance Committee has been meeting, regularly, to prepare the 2011 budget.
- Senator Bucco notified the town that a Department of Community Affairs grant was awarded in the amount of \$200,000, to provide rehabilitation to approximately 10 homes of low to moderate income families. Mayor Dodd thanked Senator Bucco for his efforts.
- Morris Habitat for Humanity has shown interest in the construction of a home on Spring Street. Mayor Dodd will keep the public informed once more information becomes available.
- Mayor Dodd read to four (4) North Dover Elementary kindergarten classes for Dr. Seuss' birthday (Read across America). He read the "thank you" note given to him from one of the classes.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT – Attorney Pennella noted that there has been no change in status of litigation since the last meeting.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, IN AN AGGREGATE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,988,743 OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, the Town of Dover (the "Town"), County of Morris, New Jersey adopted Bond Ordinance No. 14-2009 on August 25, 2009, which authorized bonds or notes of the Town in the principal amount of \$929,879; and

WHEREAS, the Town adopted Bond Ordinance No. 16-2010 on September 14, 2010 which authorized bonds or notes of the Town in the principal amount of \$706,750; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the above ordinances the Town issued a \$1,636,629 General Obligation General Improvement Bond Anticipation Note (the "Prior Improvement Note") dated December 15, 2010 and maturing March 15, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Town of adopted Bond Ordinance No. 37-2008 on December 15, 2008, which authorized the issuance of Parking Utility Notes pursuant to which the Town issued \$352,114 bond anticipation note dated March 17, 2009 which matured March 16, 2010, which were redeemed by \$352,114 Bond Anticipation Note issued March 16, 2010 which matures March 15, 2011 (the "Prior Parking Utility Note" and together with the Prior Improvement Note, the "Prior Note")

WHEREAS, the Town has determined that it is in the best interest of the Town to authorize an issuance of bond anticipation notes to redeem the Prior Note.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8, the following amounts of Bond Anticipation Notes (the "Notes") shall be issued at such dates and in such amounts as is determined by the Chief Financial Officer and/or acting Chief Financial Officer in accordance with this resolution:

- (I.) General Obligation General Improvement Bond Anticipation Notes:
 - a. pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 14-2009, Notes in the principal amount of not to exceed \$929,879 shall be issued to redeem the Prior Improvement Note, and for the purposes stated therein.
 - b. pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 16-2010, Notes in the principal amount of not to exceed \$706,750 shall be issued to redeem the Prior Improvement Note, and for the purposes stated therein.
- (II) Parking Utility Bond Anticipation Notes:
 - a. pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 37-2008, Notes in the principal amount of not to exceed \$\$352,114 shall be issued to redeem the Prior Parking Utility Note, and for the purposes stated therein.

Section 2. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 40A:2-26 of the Local Bond Law of New Jersey, particularly paragraph (f) thereof, and in lieu of the sale of more than one (1) issue of bonds or notes as provided for in said Local Bond Law, the issues of bonds and notes of the Town authorized pursuant to the Ordinances of the Town hereinabove set forth shall be combined into two (2) concurrent issues of Notes in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,988,743.

Section 3. The following matters in connection with said Notes are hereby determined:

(a) All notes issued hereunder and any renewal thereof, shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer and/or acting Chief Financial Officer of the Town, provided that any note issued pursuant hereto shall be issued for a period not to exceed one (1) year, but all such notes, including renewals, shall mature and be paid in accordance with the Local Bond Law.

(b) All notes issued hereunder shall bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer and/or acting Chief Financial Officer of the Town.

(c) The notes shall be in a form as permitted by law and approved by Bond Counsel, and issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and any such notes or any renewal thereof, may be signed or sealed by officers of the Town in any

manner permitted by Section 40A:2-25 of said Law notwithstanding what is otherwise set forth herein.

Section 4. The Chief Financial Officer and/or acting Chief Financial Officer of the Town is hereby authorized and directed to determine all matters in connection with said Notes or any renewal thereof, not determined by this or a subsequent resolution and his/her signature upon said Notes shall be conclusive as to such determinations.

Section 5. The Chief Financial Officer and/or Chief Financial Officer of the Town is hereby authorized to sell said Notes or any renewal thereof, from time to time at public or private sale in such amounts as he/she may determine at not less than par value and to deliver the same from time to time to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from the dated date of the Notes to the date of delivery thereof and payment therefore.

Section 6. Any instrument issued pursuant to this resolution shall be a general obligation of the Town, and the Town's faith and credit are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said obligation and, unless otherwise paid or payment provided for, an amount sufficient for such payment shall be inserted in the budget and a tax sufficient to provide for the payment thereof shall be levied and collected.

The governing body of the Town hereby covenants on behalf of the Town to take any action necessary or refrain from taking any action in order to preserve the tax exempt status of the debt obligations authorized hereunder as is required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, including compliance with said Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

PUBLIC COMMENTS – Three Minutes per Person

Edward Ridner – Chief of Dover Fire Department – Mr. Ridner asked Attorney Pennella for a response to the comment made by an individual concerning the raffle held at the fire house during the super bowl event. Attorney Pennella noted that an individual brought to the attention of the board that the fire department held an inappropriate gamming event (football pool) at the municipal building. Attorney Pennella noted that there wasn't a violation of the law and provided specifics. Mr. Ridner read a letter responding to Alderman Poolas' comment regarding the face book page.

Eric Berg – Assistant Chief of the Dover Fire Dept. – Mr. Berg read a "thank you" letter from the homeowner of Thompson Avenue, who had a house fire two weeks ago. The resident thanked the fire department for responding to the house fire and for the slide show that was shown to him.

Edward Correa – 888 E. Blackwell St. - Mr. Correa wanted to know the estimated amount the town would lose if the joint court converted to a shared court. Mayor Dodd provided details in reference to the possible conversion of the court system. Mayor Dodd noted that an evaluation was performed on the conversion of the courts and the expected cost would be approximately \$1,500. He explained that the difference between the two courts, a shared court requires separate accounting (separate bank accounts & ticket books) which a joint court only requires one account.

Emiliano Lemos – 48 Second St – Mr. Lemos wanted to know if the owner of the house located on Thompson Avenue, that caught on fire was owner occupied or rented. Chief Ridner expressed that it was rented. Mr. Lemos also noted that the video that was posted on face book shows a minor, at the location of the house fire, without proper equipment. Mr. Ridner noted that personnel issues have been handled within the department. Mayor Dodd asked for Attorney Pennella's opinion. Attorney Pennella is not able to respond on the comments of the minor since he doesn't have the information to render an opinion. Mr. Pennella noted that if there was a violation, the Chief has noted that personnel issues were handled.

Mayor Dodd provided clarification on the dialogue between members of the public and noted that there was a house fire in the Town of Dover and some pictures were taken and posted online which was brought to the attention of the board, by one of the aldermen. Mayor Dodd provided clarification on the dialogue between members of the public. He noted that at the last town meeting, Alderman Poolas had the expressed concern about the pictures and tonight was the response from the fire department. Mayor Dodd praised the Fire Department for their dedication.

Michelle Vega – 62 E. Dickerson St. Ms. Vega provided pictures of a pot hole at the corner of Dickerson Street and Morris Street. She asked if someone could look into the matter. Mayor Dodd will forward the comment to the Public Works Department.

Mayor Dodd reminded the public that his office is open on the third Saturday of each month for constituent's day. Mayor Dodd noted that William Close, Michael Hantson and Alderman Visioli were also present at the New Jersey Future forum. He also noted that the municipal budget for the past 3 years has been posted on the town's website.
