ORDINANCE(S) FOR SECOND READING:

ORDINANCE NO. 18-2018

AN ORDINANCE BY TOWN OF DOVER CONCERNING THE DOVER POLICE DEPARTMENT AND AMENDING THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF DOVER ENTITLED POLICE DEPARTMENT, "ARTICLE I, ORGANIZATION AND MEMBERSHIP" AND "ARTICLE V, TABLE OF ORGANIZATION".

WHEREAS, the Town of Dover has determined that substantial changes to the organization of its police department are necessary;

WHEREAS, the Town's Mayor and Board of Alderman have reviewed and updated the "Police Department" section of its Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen as follows:

- Section 1. Chapter 57, Article I, and Article V, of the Town of Dover, County of Morris and State of New Jersey are hereby repealed.
- Section 2. A NEW Chapter 57, Article I, of the "Code of the Town of Dover", as set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby adopted to set forth the basic structure, powers and duties of the Dover Police Department, and to replace the aforementioned provisions of the "Code of the Town of Dover."
 - <u>Section 3.</u> All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance are repealed.
- Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion thereof.
- Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its final adoption and publication as provided for by law. The provisions of the attached Chapter 57, Article I, shall be applicable within Dover upon taking effect and shall become a part of the new Dover Town Code once completed and adopted.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING THE SUBSECTION OF THE REVISED GENERAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF DOVER ENTITLED, "WATER CHARGES FOR DOMESTIC, COMMERCIAL, PUBLIC AND INDUSTRIAL USE IN THE TOWN OF DOVER, BOROUGH OF VICTORY GARDENS, AND PORTIONS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RANDOLPH, TOWNSHIP OF ROCKAWAY, TOWNSHIP OF MINE HILL AND BOROUGH OF WHARTON"

WHEREAS, the Water Utility provides water service in the Town of Dover, Borough of Victory Gardens, and portions of the Township of Randolph, Township of Rockaway, Township of Mine Hill and Borough of Wharton; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE SIGNING OF GOVERNMENT ENERGY AGGREGATION PROGRAM AGREEMENTS

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has been engaged in a process to establish a competitive market place through deregulation and restructuring the electric and natural gas utility markets; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a governmental energy aggregation program ("GEA Program") to purchase electric generation service and natural gas pursuant to the Government Energy Act of 2003, *N.J.S.A.* 48:3-93.1 *et seq.* ("Act") and the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities' implementing rules at *N.J.A.C.* 14:4-6.1 *et seq.* ("Rules") will increase competition for the provision of electric power and natural gas to residential and non-residential electricity and gas ratepayers, thereby increasing the likelihood of lower electric rates and natural gas rates for these users without causing an interruption in service; and

WHEREAS, under a GEA Program the residential ratepayers may have the opportunity to receive a direct reduction in their electric bills through the bulk purchase of energy from a third-party energy supplier; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance #16-2018 adopted by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on November 27, 2018, the Town of Dover publicly declared its intent to commence a GEA Program by participating in the Morris Area Energy Co-Op and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Wharton is the Lead Agency for the Morris Area Energy Co-Op program and shall accept or reject pricing on behalf of the Cooperative and its participant members; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Dover, as a participating member of the Morris Area Energy Co-Op program hereby agrees to proceed with the program, by signing the Supplier Agreement, should the Borough of Wharton accept pricing, which provides a savings on the supply portion of the electric bill for the residential energy aggregation program; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Wharton appointed Concord Engineering dba Concord Energy Services (CES) for the Morris Area Energy Co-Op to serve as the Energy Agents to assist and administer the GEA program at no cost to the Borough of Wharton or Morris Area Energy Co-Op or its participating members; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, duly assembled in public session, as follows:

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5), the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a Cooperative Pricing Agreement with the Lead Agency.

- 1. The Lead Agency shall be responsible for complying with the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40A: 11-1 et. seq.) and all other provisions of the revised statutes of the State of New Jersey.
- 2. The Town of Dover as a participating member of the Morris Area Energy Co-Op program hereby agrees to proceed with the program, by signing the Supplier Agreement, should the Borough of Wharton accept pricing, which provides a reduction on the supply portion of the electric bill for the residential energy aggregation program;
- 3. The Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Treasurer or other municipal office is hereby authorized and directed to execute, on behalf of the Town of Dover any documents necessary to carry out the purpose of this Resolution including the Supplier Services Agreement providing a reduction is achieved at the time of auction.

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR & BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER DESIGNATING TOWPATH REALTY, LLC. CONDITIONAL REDEVELOPER FOR THE PROPERTIES COMMONLY KNOWN AS BLOCK 1206, LOT 16; BLOCK 1205, LOTS 1, 2, 10, 11, 12 & 13; AND BLOCK 1204, LOTS 1 & 2 ON THE TAX MAP OF THE TOWN OF DOVER

WHEREAS, the Town of Dover has designated the entire Town as an "Area in Need of Rehabilitation" by Resolution No. RL-129 adopted on August 9, 2005 in accordance with the "Local Redevelopment and Housing Law (LRHL); and

WHEREAS, the Town of Dover adopted the "Bassett Highway Redevelopment Plan" for a portion of the Town which includes Block 1206, Lot 16; Block 1205, Lots 1, 2, 10, 11, 12 & 13; and Block 1204, Lots 1 & 2; and

WHEREAS, said Redevelopment Plan allows for the selection of a redeveloper for a redevelopment and/or rehabilitation project on lands comprising between one (1) and five (5) acres; and

WHEREAS, Towpath Realty, LLC is the contract purchaser of certain real property known as Block 1206, Lot 16; Block 1205, Lots 1, 2, 10, 11, 12 & 13; and

WHEREAS, Towpath Realty, LLC has expressed a desire to Redevelop / Rehabilitate the existing properties; and

WHEREAS, Towpath Realty, LLC has prepared and reviewed with the Town Engineer and Planner, along with the Town Administrator and Mayor, conceptual plans for the Redevelopment of said properties;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the Town of Dover as follows:

Towpath Realty, LLC is hereby designated as conditional redeveloper of certain real property known as Block 1206, Lot 16; Block 1205, Lots 1, 2, 10, 11, 12 & 13; and Block 1204, Lots 1 & 2 in the Town of Dover and within the Bassett Highway Redevelopment Plan Area, for a period of one hundred eighty (180) days commencing the date of adoption of this Resolution and as same may be extended by act of the Mayor and Board of Alderman, if in the judgment of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, the parties are proceeding in good faith and making progress toward the achievements of the goals of the Town of Dover, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. An amendment of the Bassett Highway Redevelopment Plan in accordance with the LRHL, acceptable to the Town of Dover and Redeveloper that will permit an as of right project on terms agreed to by the parties.
- 2. Negotiation of mutually acceptable Redevelopment Agreements.
- 3. Negotiation of mutually acceptable Financial Agreements for payments in lieu of taxes for the project, if applicable.
- 4. Posting of an escrow to cover the costs to the Town of Dover for professional services related to this project.

Alderwoman Romaine has moved the foregoing resolution be adopted and duly seconded by Alderman Picciallo passed by the following roll call vote.

Dominic Timpani—2 Elm Street, Dover—Mr. Timpani addressed the Municipal Attorney regarding an OPRA Request and the process in obtaining information. He spoke to Mayor Dodd regarding the fire that occurred on Blackwell Street and the November 4th incident.

Joan Smith—18 James Street, Dover—Ms. Smith thanked the Mayor and Board for allowing her to serve the Town of Dover for the last 44 years.
