CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES April 28, 2015 7:00 PM

The Caucus Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen was held in council chambers, 37 N. Sussex Street, Dover, New Jersey.

Mayor Dodd called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor asked everyone to remain standing for a moment of silence for our troops, past and present.

PROCLAMATION: RELAY FOR LIFE OF CENTRAL MORRIS COUNTY

Mayor Dodd presented a proclamation recognizing May 2015 to be PAINT THE TOWN PURPLE within Dover and to further proclaim June 6th and 7th to be AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY'S RELAY FOR LIFE OF CENTRAL MORRIS COUNTY. Mayor Dodd introduced Bonnie Rosenthal from the American Cancer Society thanking her for all her hard work with the American Cancer Society and helping with the relay. Mayor Dodd is one of seven mayors sponsoring the relay this year and urged everyone to participate in the relay and activities because "Together we can find a cure".

Bonnie Rosenthal spoke about the event after being introduced and thanked Mayor Dodd for being the first Mayor to sponsor the relay and stated that she was proud of Mayor Dodd and the Town of Dover for their sponsorship.

REDEVELOPMENT

Mayor Dodd stated that a lot of time and effort has been spent on the downtown redevelopment project and publicly thanked Michael Hantson and his staff for an excellent job. Mayor Dodd also publicly thanked George from Capodagli Property Group for being one of the first companies to take on such a big risk with the downtown redevelopment project.

Michael Hantson spoke about the long road through the planning process for the downtown area and that the presentation given tonight by Capodagli Property Group is just another step of the journey. The presentation is essentially to get the endorsement for the execution of the re-developers agreement which on May 27, 2015 will be presented to the Planning Board. Michael Hantson commented on some exemptions such as making Dickerson St. a one-way road heading east to avoid traffic buildup and accidents which have occurred in the past due to the fact that cars make left hand turns onto Dickerson St. off of Morris Ave. Michael Hantson also commented that the building couldn't be more than 360 or so feet wide, which is based on the tax map width of the properties, the building is actually a few feet wider which would require an exemption. All exemptions will require the approval of the Planning Board.

Representatives from Capodagli Property Group were present to give a presentation on the downtown redevelopment project. Mr. Kit Duggal thanked Michael and the Mayor for working together with Capodagli Property Group to make the project a possibility. Christiano Pereira from CPA Architecture spoke about the changes to the building's façade and features like the lighting, lobby décor and retail space. Mayor Dodd's concern is with the look of the building's wall and noted that the setbacks are not noticeable. He suggested installing bay windows to break up the wall so that it doesn't look so long. Mayor Dodd also noted that he's not happy with the round corners of the building. Mr. Pereria acknowledged both concerns. Jamie Giurintano, H2m Architects spoke about the details on the parking for this project. Mr. Hantson explained that the project will be consistent with the green line of the form based code.

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen was held in council chambers, 37 N. Sussex Street, Dover, New Jersey.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Dodd at 8:00 pm

ROLL CALL

Clerk Verga stated adequate notice was given to the official newspaper.

Mayor Dodd opened the meeting to the public on any agenda items. Seeing no hands and hearing no voices, Mayor Dodd closed the meeting to the public.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor reported on the following:

- <u>South Second Street Soccer Field Project</u> Drainage work is complete. Site/Field improvements are nearing completion and the field turf installation is slated within the next few weeks. The project is on target for a completion date of end of June.
- <u>NJDOT Public Information Meeting</u> The New Jersey Department of Transportation will be hosting a public information meeting open to all residents and interested parties in these chambers on Wednesday, May 6, 2015 from 6 pm to 8 pm. Department representatives will be on hand to explain and answer questions pertaining to the Prospect Street Bridge Project. Maps and plans will be available for public viewing.
- <u>S. Morris Street Projects</u> Work commenced this week on the signal pre-emption project and the grade crossing surface replacement project. The projects are expected to be completed by the end of May.
- <u>2014 Small Cities Grant</u> The 2014 Small Cities grant project is well underway and progress is being realized. This project is utilizing nearly \$500,000 of federal funds, which was awarded via a competitive grant. The project is taking place in the Baker, Fairview and Pequannock area and consists of road reconstruction, sewers, water main/lines, milling and paving. Completion date is scheduled for July.
- <u>Special Improvement District –</u> The town continues to progress towards the creation of a special improvement district in the Blackwell Street and downtown business district. The Improvement District provides a mechanism for the businesses and property owners of our downtown area to organize as a single entity, to raise funds for activities that enhance or expand upon municipal services, and through a District Management Corporation, to manage a more effective destination for commerce. This is a novel way to help our business district thrive as a destination and to make aesthetic improvements and general maintenance upgrades without cost to the Town. The Improvement District is the perfect complement to the improvements forthcoming through our various Redevelopment Projects.
- <u>Town Newsletter</u> The bi-annual town newsletter has gone to the printer and will be in mailboxes next week.
- Everbridge Reverse 911 Reminded residents to register for alert specific information on the town's webpage.
- <u>Whoosh!</u> As a reminder, Dover now has "Whoosh!" available at all paid town parking lots. The benefits of "Whoosh!" include: an easy way to pay for parking; get text reminder when time is running out; extend time remotely and avoid parking fines; and get an electronic history of parking payments.
- <u>Mayor's Annual Fishing Derby</u> is scheduled for May 16, 2015 at Hurd Park. Mayor Dodd commented that Fania Roofing donated 15 fishing poles.
- <u>Movie Schedule</u> movies will be held at JFK starting at 7 pm (1) Friday May 29th Big Hero Six, (2) Friday June 26th The Boxtrolls, (3) July 31st E.T., (4) Friday August 28th The Lego Movie.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 72, SALARIES AND COMPENSATION

ORDINANCE FOR SECOND READING/PUBLIC HEARING

ORDINANCE NO. 04 -2015 ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER <u>AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF DOVER, CHAPTER 349</u> ENTITLED TAXICABS AND LIMOUSINES Ord. 3-2006 and Ord. 10-2006

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Dover, County of Morris, and State of New Jersey as follows:

Chapter 349 of the Code of Dover is amended and supplemented as set forth below:

§ 349-6. Insurance and power of attorney requirements.

Upon applying for a regulated vehicle license, owners or operators shall furnish proof of an insurance policy covering each regulated vehicle in accordance with <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 48:16-1 et. seq., as amended and supplemented from time to time. However, minimum coverage requirements for each regulated vehicle are \$100,000 per occurrence. Operators must produce proof that the required insurance policy will be in effect and has been prepaid for the entire period the requested license will be effective (usually June 1 through May 31). Each owner shall also execute and deliver to the Town Clerk the required power of attorney in accordance with <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 48:16-5, as amended and supplemented from time to time.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this within ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

The Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE NO. 06-2015 OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY ESTABLISHING CHAPTER 2-6€ OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF DOVER ENTITLED "LICENSE INSPECTOR."

K. Films or Movie Shoots;

L. Dog licenses shall be issued by the bureau of central licensing under the supervision of the chief license inspector, but the control of the dog warden and the assistants and enforcement of all ordinances pertaining to dogs shall remain the responsibility of the Health Department;

M. Autobuses. The functions of the administration and enforcement of all ordinances in connection with autobuses are the responsibility of the bureau of central licensing under the supervision of the chief license inspector.

ORDINANCE NO. 07-2015 CALENDAR YEAR 2015 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40a:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N,J.S.40A"4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 0.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover in the County of Morris finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2015 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby determines that a 2.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$324,901 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, in the County of Morris, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2015 budget year, the final appropriations of the Town of Dover shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$568,576 and that the CY 2015 municipal budget for the Town of Dover be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon; be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

WHEREAS, Capodagli has submitted a proposed project for the phased development of a portion of the Study Area comprised of the following properties: Block 1216, Lot 3; Block 1217 and Lots 9 & 20 (the "**Phase 1A Property**"); Block 1208, Lot 7 (the "**Phase 1B Property**") and Block 1902, Lots 22, 23 & 24 (the "**Phase 2 Property**") (the Phase 1A, Phase 1B and Phase 2 Properties referred to collectively herein as the "**Property**"), and has demonstrated its credentials and its ability to perform as the Redeveloper of the Property; and

WHEREAS, Capodagli has been working with the Town professionals, engineer and legal counsel, who have reviewed and commented upon the plans and designs for the Projects and have been negotiating the material terms for a redevelopment of the Property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12A-9, it is the desire of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen to enter into a Redevelopment Agreement, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, and Shared Parking Agreement, attached hereto as **Exhibit B**, to further define and memorialize the respective obligations of the parties with regard to proceeding with the redevelopment of the Property in the manner prescribed.

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2014, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen adopted Resolution #245-2014, designating the following properties as a "non-condemnation" redevelopment area, pursuant to the LRHL: Block 1216, Lot 3; Block 1217, Lots 9 & 20; Block 1208, Lot 7; and Block 1902, Lots 22, 23 & 24, as identified on the Official Tax Map of the Town of Dover (the "**Study Area**"); and

WHEREAS, on December 16, 2014, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen enacted Ordinance #26-2014, adopting the *Scattered Site Redevelopment Plan*, dated November 4, 2014 (the "**Redevelopment Plan**"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen serve as an instrumentality and agency of the Town pursuant to the LRHL for the purpose of implementing the Redevelopment Plan and carrying out redevelopment projects within the Town; and

WHEREAS, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12A-8 authorizes the Town to enter into contracts or agreements for the planning, construction or undertaking of any development project or redevelopment work in an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, Capodagli has submitted a proposed project for the phased development of a portion of the Study Area comprised of the following properties: Block 1216, Lot 3; Block 1217 and Lots 9 & 20 (the "**Phase 1A Property**"); Block 1208, Lot 7 (the "**Phase 1B Property**") and Block 1902, Lots 22, 23 & 24 (the "**Phase 2 Property**") (the Phase 1A, Phase 1B and Phase 2 Properties referred to collectively herein as the "**Property**"), and has demonstrated its credentials and its ability to perform as the Redeveloper of the Property; and

WHEREAS, Capodagli has formed single purpose urban renewal entities to implement each Project and has demonstrated to the Town its credentials, experience and financial capability to design and construct the Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12A-9, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen designated Meridia, Transit Plaza Urban Renewal, Dover, LLC, Meridia, Campus Center Urban Renewal, Dover, LLC and Meridia, Gateway Urban Renewal, Dover, LLC, each affiliates of Capodagli Property Company, LLC, as redeveloper for the Property and authorized the execution of a Redevelopment Agreement for the Property; and

WHEREAS, Meridia, Transit Plaza Urban Renewal, Dover, LLC has been working with the Town administration, planner, engineer and legal counsel, who have reviewed and commented upon the plans and designs for the Phase 1A Property, as set forth more specifically in a submittal package on file in the Town of Dover Engineering Department (the "Submittal Package") and have recommended acceptance and approval of certain deviations and variations from the Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, Meridia, Transit Plaza Urban Renewal, Dover, LLC presented to the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen its concept plans for the redevelopment of the Phase 1A Property, as set forth in the Submittal Package; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen find the redevelopment concept plan for the Phase 1A Property set forth in the Submittal Package to be consistent with the Redevelopment Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover that:

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 *et seq.*, as amended (the "**Redevelopment** Law"), authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land in the municipality constitute areas in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, to determine whether certain parcels of land constitute an area in need of redevelopment, under the Redevelopment Law the Mayor & Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover (the "**Governing Body**") must authorize the Planning Board to conduct a preliminary investigation of the area and make recommendations to the Governing Body; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby requests that an investigation occur with respect to the property commonly known as:

Block 1902, Lots 25, 26, 27 & 28 Block 1902, Lots 20 & 21

on the Tax Maps of the Town of Dover (the "**Study Area**"), to determine whether the Study Area meets the criteria set forth in the Redevelopment Law, specifically *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-5, and should be designated as an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, if the Study Area is determined to meet the criteria for designation as an area in need of redevelopment, and upon adoption of a Redevelopment Plan the Governing Body further authorizes the Town to use all of those powers provided under the Redevelopment Law for use in a redevelopment area, <u>excluding</u> the power of eminent domain (a "**Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area**" as defined in the Redevelopment Law) pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-6.a; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that it is in the best interests of the Town to direct the Planning Board to undertake a preliminary investigation of the Study Area pursuant to the procedures of the Redevelopment Law and provide its recommendations to the Governing Body;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Town of Dover, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

Section 2. The Planning Board is hereby authorized and directed to conduct an investigation pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-6 to determine whether the Study Area satisfies the criteria set forth in *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-5 to be designated as an area in need of redevelopment, which designation would permit the Town to utilize all of the redevelopment powers, excluding eminent domain (as defined in the Redevelopment Law, a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area).

<u>Section 3.</u> As part of its investigation, the Planning Board shall prepare maps showing the boundaries of the Study Areas and the location of the parcels contained therein and appended thereto shall be a statement setting forth the basis of the investigation.

Section 4. The Planning Board shall conduct a public hearing in accordance with the Redevelopment Law, specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6, after giving due notice of the proposed boundary of the Study Area, the date of the hearing and the municipal option not to exercise the power of eminent domain (Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area), to any persons who are interested in or would be affected by a determination that the Study Area is an area in need of redevelopment. The notice of the hearing shall specifically state that the redevelopment area determination would not authorize the Town

to exercise the power of eminent domain to acquire any property in the delineated area, for the Study Area is being investigated as a possible Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area.

<u>Section 5</u>. At the public hearing, the Planning Board shall hear from all persons who are interested in or would be affected by a determination that a Study Area is a redevelopment area. All objections to a determination that a Study Area is an area in need of redevelopment and evidence in support of those objections shall be received and considered by the Planning Board and made part of the public record.

Section 6. After conducting its investigation, preparing a map of the Study Areas, and conducting a public hearing at which all objections to the designations are received and considered, the Planning Board shall make recommendations to the Governing Body as to whether the Governing Body should designate the Study Area as an area in need of redevelopment <u>excluding</u> eminent domain (as defined in the Redevelopment Law, a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area), pursuant to the Redevelopment Law.

Section 7. This resolution shall be effective in accordance with applicable law.
