REGULAR MEETING MINUTES June 10, 2008

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen was held in council chambers, 37 N. Sussex Street, Dover, New Jersey.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Dodd at 7:10pm

ROLL CALL

Present: Aldermen Fahy, Delaney, Poolas, Visioli, Donofrio, Picciallo, Timpani and Mayor Dodd

Absent Alderwomen Romaine

Also present were Administrator Garvin, Attorney Pennella and Clerk Verga

Clerk Verga stated adequate notice was given to the official newspaper.

Mayor Dodd opened this portion of the meeting to the public for agenda items only.

COMMENTS ON ANA LARA'S DISCHARGE OF MORTGAGE:

Blaise DeMasi: Attorney for Ana Lara: Mr. DeMasi noted that the previous contract had different amounts and names on the HUD-1 form. The HUD-1 form has been updated with the correct information. Mr. DeMasi stated that the new agreement allows for a settlement to the Town of Dover for \$7,000 of the \$14,000 of the lien.

Alderman Poolas asked if the buyer was related to the seller.

Christian Vega: 18 Hillside Avenue, Dover – Mr. Vega confirmed that the buyer has no relation to the seller.

Alderman Fahy wanted to know if the town approved the settlement, would it be removed from foreclosure. Mr. DeMasi noted that a dismissal of foreclosure could be granted if the closing took place and checks were issued to the lenders in time.

Mayor Dodd wanted to know if the owners have any intention of living in the property since they have an address in Florida. Mr. Vega noted that the family has intentions of moving to New Jersey and plan to owner occupy the property.

Administrator Garvin's Report – No report

Mayor Dodd's Report – Mayor Dodd noted that on June 17th the high school has been reserved for an information session for Certified Valutions, Inc. to explain the revaluation process. Mayor Dodd explained that the Bassett Hwy. negotiations are back on the table and a committee meeting is scheduled for tomorrow night.

ALDERMEN/COMMITTEE REPORTS -

Alderman Fahy – No Report

Alderman Picciallo – Alderman Picciallo reported that Mill Pond Tower's has replaced all the windows in the building however residents complained that they were not permitted to install their air conditioners. He also noted that residents were required to pay \$350 for the maintenance man to install the units. Alderman Picciallo and Mayor Dodd were referred to HUD and a representative did intervene. The matter has been rectified. He expressed that Costco has donated cases of Gatorade to Mill Pond Towers' residents to help with the heat situation.

Alderman Poolas – Alderman Poolas reported that the Memorial Association will hold a flag retirement ceremony at Hurd Park-Veteran's Path on June 14th which is also remembered as Flag Day.

Alderman Donofrio – Alderman Donofrio attended the Board of Health meeting and noted if a restaurant is visited and receives a conditional rating a \$100 fee will be charged for a re-inspection. He noted that on the Prospect Street Bridge there's a deep man hole which should be addressed.

Alderman Timpani – Alderman Timpani noted the Fishing Derby Awards Ceremony is scheduled for the next town



meeting. Alderman Timpani has been busy campaigning and made an announcement that if his fourth ward residents need to ask questions or file a compliant he's available by phone and e-mail which is stated on any literature that is sent to them.

Alderman Delaney – Alderman Delaney noted that East Dover School has started to install the new playground. The Fire Department will have a ladder testing day to insure the safety of the ladders.

Alderman Visioli – Alderman Visioli requested input from the board regarding the towing ordinance. He noted that at the next meeting he would have a draft for a garage sale ordinance. Alderman Visioli and few members of the board noticed about 23 vacated dwellings with property maintenance issues which have been forwarded to the proper department. He expressed that he is researching an ordinance to hold the bank and/or real estate agents responsible for property maintenance of vacated homes.

Alderwomen Romaine – Absent

Attorney Pennella Report – Attorney Pennell reported that Azua Taxi & Limo has had their case dismissed with prejudice and they are no longer participating in the lawsuit.

ORDINANCE(S) FOR INTRODUCTION

ORDINANCE NO. 16-2008 AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CODE SECTION 349 (ORDINANCES 03-2006 AND 10-2006)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 349-14, C, stating "Render reasonable, prompt and adequate service" and Section 349-13, O, stating that "shall be clean and neat and appropriately dressed" are hereby stricken from Ordinance No. 03-2006 and a line shall be drawn through these phrases and a footnote included that such language was declared unconstitutionally vague by order of the Superior Court of New Jersey in the matter of <u>Apple Limo – Taxi Service, Inc., et al. vs. Town of Dover, et al.</u>

SECTION 2: Section 349, B (4) of Ordinance No. 10-2006 requiring an appellant to speak "sufficient" English..., is to be supplemented by inserting an asterisk after the word "sufficient" and adding by asterisk at the end of the paragraph the following language: "The Superior Court of New Jersey has held that an English language requirement is constitutional as long as the Town of Dover establishes standards with respect to what is meant by 'sufficient' and absent such standard, the 'sufficient' English requirement is unenforceable."

SECTION 3: Section 349-20 of Ordinance 03-2006 is amended and supplemented to read as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, the town of Dover requires a limousine service to obtain a corporate license, permit, certificate or other form of authority if the limousine service is providing service on an intra-municipal point-to-point basis within the Town of Dover. The fee for the issuance of this license is \$50.00 (which is addition to any other fee) which applies all limousines operated by a limousine service providing such intra-municipal point-to-point service within the Town of Dover.

SECTION 4: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this within ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 5: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 6: The Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.

WHEREAS, the borrower, Ana Lara, is attempting to do a short sale to Aida Hernandez for the amount of \$257,000.00; and

WHEREAS, such sale cannot take place as long as the Town of Dover mortgage continues to exist; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Lara has requested the Town of Dover to discharge its mortgage in return for a \$7,000.00 payment to be paid by Countrywide Home Loans, Inc. to the Town of Dover;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, Morris County, NJ as follows:



- 1. The Town of Dover hereby authorizes the Discharge of Town of Dover Housing Rehabilitation Program Mortgage in the amount of \$14,060.00 filed in Mortgage Book 20846 page 0163 on June 18, 2007 for the sum of \$7,000.00;
- 2. The debt, however, is not forgiven and the balance owned on the Note remains due and payable

to the Town.

3. The Administrator is hereby authorized to execute the Discharge of Mortgage.
