BOND ORDINANCE REAPPROPRIATING \$2,500,000 PROCEEDS OF OBLIGATIONS NOT NEEDED FOR THEIR ORIGINAL PURPOSE IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL PROJECTS IN AND BY THE TOWN OF DOVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39, it is hereby determined that \$2,500,000 of the proceeds of obligations originally made available pursuant to Section 3(b) of Bond Ordinance #01-2008 of the Town of Dover, in the County of Morris, New Jersey (the "Town"), finally adopted February 27, 2018, are no longer necessary for the acquisition, by purchase, and improvements of the Berkeley College building and improvement of the adjacent property in and by the Town, for which the obligations previously were authorized.

Section 2. The \$2,500,000 described in Section 1 and made available pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39, is hereby reappropriated to provide for the following capital improvements:

ORDINANCE No. 22-2020

ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY MODIFYING THE RATES OF COMPENSATION FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS PERFORMING OFF-DUTY WORK

WHEREAS, on April 24, 2019, the Town of Dover (the "Town") signed a collective bargaining agreement with the Policemen's Benevolent Association, Dover Local No. 107 for the term of January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2019, the Town signed a collective bargaining agreement with the Superior Officers' Association, Dover Local No. 107 for the term of January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the terms of these collective bargaining agreements, the Town agreed to modify the contracting rates for law enforcement officers performing off-duty work.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for the Town of Dover, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1: Article 18, "Rates of Compensation; Administrative Fee; Payment for Services," of Chapter 57, "Police Department," shall be and hereby is amended as follows:

- § 57-18 Rates of compensation; administrative fee; payment for services.
 - A. All members of the Policemen's Benevolent Association, Dover Local No. 107, shall be paid at the premium, overtime rate for the top-paid patrol officer for all third-party services.
 - B. All members of the Superior Officers' Association, Dover Local No. 107, shall be paid at the overtime rate of the Deputy Chief for all third-party services
 - C. All officers shall additionally be paid an additional \$5.00 per hour for each regular hour worked between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. for all third-party services.
 - B. An additional 20% per hour for any person or entity and 10% per hour for nonprofit organizations is hereby established to cover administrative costs, overhead, and out-of-pocket expenses of the Town of Dover.
 - C. The Town of Dover Board of Education is exempt from the administrative fee.
 - D. In the event that off-duty work is performed for either the Town of Dover Board of Education or for a non-emergency planned capital improvement to be paid for exclusively by the Town of Dover, the off-duty rate shall be consistent with the terms of

the then-current collective bargaining agreement with the Policemen's Benevolent Association, Dover Local No. 107.

SECTION 2: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this within ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.

- 3. It will comply with the Fair Housing Act of 1968 and will affirmatively further fair housing; and
- 4. It will comply with the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and with the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that <u>Tamara Bross</u> shall be designated as the Fair Housing Officer for the Town of Dover; and
