

TOWN OF DOVER MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN

CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES December 16, 2014 7:00 PM

The Caucus Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen was held in council chambers, 37 N. Sussex Street, Dover, New Jersey.

Mayor Dodd called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

ROLL CALL:

Clerk Verga stated adequate notice was given to the official newspaper

PRESENTATION: DOVER DOWNTOWN SCATTERED SITE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN

Mr. Michael Hantson explained that the ordinance titled "adopting scattered site redevelopment plan..." is a zoning ordinance for the particular properties that have been designated as areas in need of redevelopment. He explained that certain steps have to been taken by the planning board and the governing body to move forward certain resolutions and ordinances. The last approved step was the approval of a study so the next logical step is to come up with zoning requirements for those particular properties. He noted that the zoning requirements are not that complex since the town has been through a long lengthy planning process which includes the creation of a master plan for transit oriented development, amendments to the land use plan, amongst other plans and the adoption of the form based code ordinance for the downtown area. He noted that the intention was not to substantially change anything that was already done in that process but did express some changes were implemented using the form based code ordinance as a reference. He introduced Mr. David Roberts to explain those changes.

Mr. Roberts provided the board and public with a power point presentation on the scatter site redevelopment plan. He also answered questions from the public and board. The presentation tied into the form based code ordinance.

<u>Frank Simini</u> – 69 Penn Avenue – Mr. Simini asked for clarification on the modified setback off of Dickerson Street. Mr. Hantson commented that there's no requirement for setbacks in the downtown area. However, it was explained that the design of the building will require indentations to make it more attractive and pleasing to the eye. The term setback is used to describe that the design will allow for every so often a break in the building.

William O'Brien – 77 Van Nostrand Avenue – Mr. O'Brien wanted to know how the town will attract people to Dover. Mayor Dodd explained that the town of Dover needs to look to redevelopment to bring in new ratables to the community. He mentioned that we cannot continue to look at existing tax payers to pick up the escalating costs to operate our community. It was noted that other communities have opportunity for growth and expansion but we do not have that luxury so we need to look at redevelopment of our existing housing stock. Mr. O'Brien had a concern with the stacking and overcrowding issues in Dover. Mayor Dodd noted that they have the some concerns but the board has taken the initiatives to expand that department (code enforcement).

Mayor Dodd explained that redevelopers do their research to make sure that they can fill those spaces prior to accepting an agreement and he's confident the board will choose the right redeveloper.

<u>Mr. Martinez</u> – first name and address inaudible - He wanted to know what will happen with the day laborers that stand near the train station.

Mayor Dodd noted that it's a difficult situation but feels that the day laborers won't want to be there once they start seeing the growth in that area.

Mr. Hantson expressed that the project promotes economic development in Dover. He explained that the train station has been identified as Dover's biggest asset and the downtown district as the second. He noted that Dover solicited proposals prior to creating a plan. This was done to see if there was interest in the project and the fact the there were multiple responses shows that the redevelopment world has identified Dover as a place to invest their money and an opportunity for redevelopment similar to what has happened down the rail lines (Morristown).

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A member of the public asked for details of the buildings (# of units and price plan size). Mr. Hanston expressed that we do not have a developer's agreement, as of yet, that provides all that information. He noted that several steps need to be taken before they can start getting into specifics. Mayor Dodd reminded the public that in the 70's during urban renewal times, the buildings were removed because they thought it was a benefit for the town however the thought today is the complete opposite.

<u>Maria Tambini</u> – Blackwell Street – Ms. Tambini wanted to know about the parking for residents in those areas. Mayor Dodd noted that the parking issue is still being worked out however the thought of shared parking has been considered. She wanted confirmation as to where the buildings would be located. Mr. Hantson explained the location and the thought process on shared parking.

<u>Frank Simini</u> – 69 Penn Avenue – Mr. Simini asked if the board has a proposal from a developer. It was noted that there are several proposals on the table and specifics have not been ironed out.

ORDINANCE FOR SECOND READING/PIBLIC HEARING

ORDINANCE NO. 23-2014

OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY ESTABLISHING SECTION 1-15 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF DOVER ENTITLED "GENERAL PENALTY."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. 1.15 – GENERAL PENALTY

1.15.10 Violations and penalties—Collection.

- A. Except as otherwise provided, the violation of any provision of the code of the Town of Dover, New Jersey shall be punishable by imprisonment in the county jail or in any place provided by the Town for the detention of prisoners, for any term not exceeding ninety (90) days; or by a fine not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than two thousand (\$2,000.00); or by a period of community service not exceeding ninety (90) days; or by any combination of fine, imprisonment and community service. Each day or part thereof any violation of the code of the Town of Dover, New Jersey shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.
- B. Any person who is convicted of violating an ordinance within one year of the date of previous violation of the same ordinance and who was fined for the previous violation, shall be sentenced by the court to an additional fine as a repeat offender. The additional fine imposed by the court upon a person for a repeated offense shall not be less than the minimum or exceed the maximum fine fixed for a violation of the ordinance, but shall be calculated separately from the fine imposed for the violation of the ordinance.
- C. Any person convicted of the violation of any ordinance may, in the discretion of the court by which he or she was convicted, and in default of the payment of any fine imposed therefore, be imprisoned in the county jail or place of detention provided by the municipality, for any term not exceeding ninety (90) days, or be required to perform community service for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days.
- D. Whenever any such fine is imposed, such fine and costs and charges incident thereto may be collected in an action of debt or in such other manner as may be provided by law.

SECTION 2.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this within ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and ⁱndependent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 4.

The Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE NO. 26-2014

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS AND THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY ADOPTING SCATTERED SITE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW N.J.S.A. 40A: 12A-1 ET. SEO.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1, <u>et seq.</u>, as amended and supplemented (the "Act"), provides a process for municipalities to participate in the redevelopment and improvement of areas in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act on October 28, 2014, the Town of Dover adopted Resolution No. 245 designating Block 1216, Lot 3; Block 1217, Lots 9 & 20; Block 1208, Lot 7; and Block 1902, Lots 22, 23 & 24; as a "Non-Condemnation Area In Need of Redevelopment"; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Alderman directed the Planning Board to prepare a Redevelopment Plan for said properties pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board retained the services of David Roberts, AICP, PP, LLA, RLA of Maser Consulting, P.A., a professional engineering, planning and design firm ("Maser") to assist in preparing a Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, David Roberts, AICP, PP, LLA, RLA of Maser prepared a Redevelopment Plan entitled "Scattered Site Redevelopment Plan, Block 1216, Lot 3; Block 1217, Lots 9 & 20; Block 1208, Lot 7; and Block 1902, Lots 22-24;" dated November 4, 2014 (the "Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Plan was prepared in accordance with N.J.S.A 40A:12A-7a; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board has reviewed said Redevelopment Plan and has determined that it is substantially consistent with the Town of Dover Master Plan, the Master Plan of the County of Morris, and the State Development and Redevelopment Plan adopted pursuant to the "State Planning Act", P.L. 1985, c.398 (C.52:18A-196 et al.)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. Purpose & Intent; Background.

The purpose and intent of this Ordinance is to adopt by reference the Redevelopment Plan as prepared by Maser dated November 4, 2014 entitled "Scattered Site Redevelopment Plan, Block 1216, Lot 3; Block 1217, Lots 9 & 20; Block 1208, Lot 7; and Block 1902, Lots 22-24." This Ordinance is adopted under the authority of the Act. This Ordinance and the Redevelopment Plan, involve the properties located at Block 1216, Lot 3; Block 1217, Lots 9 & 20; Block 1208, Lot 7; and Block 1902, Lots 22-24 on the Tax Map of the Town of Dover in conformance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7.

2. Adoption of Redevelopment Plan.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby adopt by reference, and incorporates the same herein as if set forth at length, the "Scattered Site Redevelopment Plan, Block 1216, Lot 3; Block 1217, Lots 9 & 20; Block 1208, Lot 7; and Block 1902, Lots 22-24;", dated November 4, 2014. In adopting said Redevelopment Plan, the governing body hereby declares and determines that said Redevelopment Plan meets the criteria, guidelines and conditions set forth at N.J.S.A. 40A: 12A-7; provides realistic opportunities for redevelopment in said Area in Need of Redevelopment; and is otherwise in conformance with the provisions of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A.: 40A: 12A-1 et. seq. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen further find and determine that said Redevelopment Plan effectuates the objectives of the Town of Dover's Master Plan.

- 3. If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any other part thereof.
- 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted that are inconsistent with the terms and provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- 5. This Ordinance shall become final upon adoption and publication in the manner prescribed by law.

Mayor Dodd has moved the foregoing ordinance be adopted and duly seconded by Alderman Visioli and passed for second reading by the following roll call vote.
