Dear Dover Residents and Friends,

It gives me great pleasure to present the 2018 Recycling & Solid Waste Newsletter to you. The information contained, herein, is helpful in maintaining a high quality of life for our hometown and will ensure that we Keep Dover Beautiful! I look forward to hearing from you and serving you for 2018.

Over the years, we have made many improvements to our Municipal Recycling Center, which is located at 211 North Sussex Street at the Richard Newman Public Works Facility. Continuing this year, through the use of awarded grant monies and at no additional cost to you, the Recycling Center is open and staffed six days out of the week (closed Sundays) from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm. Staff will be on hand during all open hours to monitor and to maintain the Recycling Center. Due to a recent spike in the amount of contamination within the recycling stream, it was necessary and beneficial to hire these monitors to make sure that only accepted materials are placed into the recycling dumpsters, thereby eliminating recycling loads being rejected at the Materials Recycling Facility. This process maximizes our tonnage grants and lessens the tax burden on our residents. We will continue to accept White Goods and Appliances at the Recycling Center at no cost to the resident. "White Goods" are defined as all large appliances such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, etc.

In an effort to Keep Dover Beautiful!, here are some of the highlights for 2018:

- The Town will be hosting our fourth annual paper Shredding event this year on May 5, 2018.
- Removable dumpster covers have been purchased to prevent ice and snow from mixing in with the recyclables. Snow and ice can cause recyclable loads to be rejected at the recycling facility.
- Used car batteries and used motor oil will no longer be acceptable at the Recycling Center due to environmental constraints.
- Garden Trimmings will no longer be accepted in biodegradable bags you must use re-usable marked containers.
- As part of the downtown beautification project 16 new combination "Garbage and Recycling" containers have been purchased to keep the downtown clean and to keep recycling out of the solid waste stream. These containers are heavy duty and will be clearly marked for the various materials.
- 10 Clear Stream recycling containers have been purchased for community events for either indoor or outdoor use. These containers are portable and have clear labeled bags for recycling. This will help keep recycling from being placed in garbage containers.

New this year and as a free amenity to our residents, the Town is offering Mulch for plant, shrub and flower beds. Bring your own container to the DPW yard during operating hours or call ahead and schedule a free delivery to your property. What better way to Keep Dover Beautiful than by beautifying your property and keeping your plants, shrubs and flowers in tip top shape!

For your further convenience, Brush & Garden Trimmings curbside collection has been expanded to Thursdays and Fridays (see schedule). Also new, Brush/Garden Trimmings/ Christmas Trees/Grass and Leaves will now be accepted at the Recycling Center (Monday – Saturday).

Keeping our Town and public spaces clean and litter free is a year-long priority. To aide in this continuous effort, the Department of Recreation implemented a new sports anti-litter campaign titled, "Cool Down, Pick-up!" This effort directs all local sporting coaches to teach our children to clean-up after themselves as part of their cooldown sessions. We also provided teams with PBA-free water bottles to discourage athletes from bringing plastic containers that litter our fields and courts.

These initiatives to Keep Dover Beautiful! are just a small part of a larger program to teach children that littering is not acceptable and that maintaining a clean environment is part of their civic duty. I ask that all parents and guardians assist our efforts by discouraging bad littering habits at all times. Collectively, we can begin to curb this systemic problem that is costing Dover taxpayers and affecting our quality of life.

As always, I greatly appreciate your kind support and I remain honored and humbled to serve you as your Mayor.

Solid Waste Notes:

- Your solid waste cans shall be placed at the curb by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day, and no earlier than 5:00 PM on the prior evening. Receptacles must be removed by 8:00 PM on collection day.
- You may place for collection a maximum of two cans or bags (30lb. max per bag or can) at the curb for pick-up, two times per week. Additional bags or cans will only be collected if a sticker has been purchased from the Town's Health Dept.
- If your pick-up day is canceled due to a holiday or inclement weather, **no make-up date** will be scheduled. However, you will be allowed to put out double on your next scheduled collection day.
- Stickers must be purchased from the Town Health Dept. prior to pick-up of furniture/bulky waste items (sofas, chairs, mattresses, etc.) These items will be picked up by the Town's Solid Waste Hauler on the day of your regular solid waste pick-up. All solid waste containers shall be furnished with a tight fitting lid.

Recycling Notes:

- Residents whose recyclables were missed must contact the Health Department before 10:00 AM on the Monday morning following the collection day at 973-366-2200, Ext. 2120.
- The Recycling Center - located on 211 North Sussex St. - is open on Monday - Saturday from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM
- Please identify which receptacles are solid waste and which are for recycling. (Stickers available upon request in the Health Dept.) Place containers at curbside by 6:00 AM. Containers shall not exceed 50lbs.
- Stickers must be purchased from the Health Department prior to the pick-up of tires and white goods (appliances). Stickers must be purchased by 3:00 PM on Thursday for Friday pick-up.

Single-Stream Recycling



Single-stream recycling allows cans, bottles, cardboard and all other paper to be mixed together for recycling. All of these items can go into one recycling container.

Paper Recycle office paper, file folders, junk mail, envelopes, flyers, newspapers and inserts, magazines, catalogs, paperbacks and phone books, wrapping paper, paper bags, tissue and cookie boxes, paper towel cores, toilet tissue rolls, frozen food boxes, cartons and boxes used for milk, juice, soup, broth, etc., clean pizza boxes, 6-pack and 12-pack cartons from soda, clean paper ice cream containers. Corrugated cardboard must be flattened. (**Shredded paper - see below)



Plastic Recycle plastic containers (bottles and non-bottles) coded 1, 2, 4, 5, 7. Plastic caps and lids larger than 3" in diameter are acceptable*. The smallest acceptable plastic container is a 6- to 8-ounce yogurt cup*. Containers must be empty.



Metal Recycle aluminum and steel (tin) cans, loose metal jar lids, steel bottle caps, clean aluminum foil, pie plates and trays. Containers must be empty.



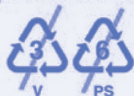
Glass Recycle glass bottles and jars with caps and lids removed. Recycle loose metal caps and lids. Bottles and jars must be empty.



Residential Curbside Collection

There is a 50-pound weight limit on recycling containers. If necessary, use multiple recycling containers. Containers must have handles. Lids are strongly recommended.

Do not recycle plastics coded 3, 6



All items must be empty and free of food residue.

No liquids
No garbage
* No plastic items smaller than 6- to 8-ounce yogurt cups; for example, do not recycle small plastic caps or pill bottles.

No hangers
No VHS/VCR tapes
No hardcover books
No flower pots or trays
No window panes, mirrors, glass vases, ceramics, or Pyrex® dishware
No stickers or address label sheet waste
No plastics other than those listed
No metal other than what is listed
No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
No paint, pesticides, oil & cleaners
No needles/medical waste
No plant material or food waste
No waxed paper or waxed cardboard
No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers

No motor oil/anti-freeze containers
** No plastic bags other than for shredded paper
** No loose shredded paper

** Shredded paper must be in clear plastic bags. Nothing else should be in a plastic bag except for shredded paper. Shred only confidential information.

Household Hazardous Wastes

Household Hazardous Wastes may be taken to Morris County MUA Facility located at 168 Goldmine Road in Flanders (Mt. Olive), NJ 07836. All deliveries are **by appointment only** Call 973-829-8006 for schedules and additional information.

Acceptable HHW

- E-Waste - Televisions, Computers, Monitors, Laptops, Printers, Fax Machines, Scanners & Audio Equipment.
- Oil-Based Paints and Varnishes, Stains, Lacquers (liquid or solidified)
- Solvents & Paint Thinners
- Propane Cylinders (BBQ sized propane cylinders cost \$5/cyl. at permanent HHW facility & there is no charge for camping stove-sized propane cyl.)
- Pesticides & Herbicides
- Pool Chemicals & Chlorine
- Batteries, if they are rechargeable and/or hazardous dry-cell batteries (button-cell and lithium). Alkaline Batteries are not hazardous and are not accepted (put them into the garbage)
- Batteries for Car & Boat (Lead-Acid)
- Automotive Fluids such as Oil, Antifreeze & Brake, Transmission & Steering Fluids etc.
- Gasoline (must be transported in certified gas can)
- Automotive Cleaning Products
- Thermometers & Thermostats containing Mercury
- Fluorescent Light Bulbs and CFLs that contain Mercury
- Asbestos in small quantities, must be under 100 lbs., wet down, double bagged, sealed with duct tape, and sized to fit into 55-gallon drums.
- Kerosene
- Aerosol Cans
- Driveway Sealant & Roofing Tar if they contain coal tar or petroleum distillates.
- Adhesives
- Caulks

- Cooking Oils
- Photography Chemicals
- Nail Polish
- Nail Polish Remover (Acetone)
- Muriatic Acid
- Caustic Cleaning Materials
- Fire Extinguishers

Unacceptable HHW

- Explosives or Highly Reactive materials since these may be dangerous! Always call first for safety instructions. DO NOT bring these materials without prior authorization! These dangerous items include, but are not limited to the following:
 - Picric Acid
 - Isopropyl Ether
 - Calcium Carbide
 - Perchloric Acid
 - Benzoyl Peroxide
- Materials in containers larger than 5 Gallons in size
- Dried, Hard, Solid Latex Paint or Empty Paint Cans; these are excepted for disposal at the transfer stations with other non-hazardous solid waste. Residents should remove the lids from these dried-out cans and dispose of both types into their household garbage.
- Latex or Water-Based Paints are not hazardous and are not accepted at MCMUA hazardous waste disposal programs. Latex paint may be safely disposed of in garbage when it is dried out. Dry out latex paint cans by stirring absorbent material such as cat litter into the paint. The paint will harden within a few minutes. Leave the lid off the can, put the

lid and the can into the regular garbage. A hazardous waste handling fee of \$1.25/pound is charged for latex paint. Latex paint will not be accepted whatsoever during one-day hazardous waste disposal events.

- Tires
- Smoke Detectors
- Medical Waste, including pharmaceuticals, syringes, and needles.
- Construction Materials such as Wood, Treated Lumber, Asphalt, or Concrete. Appliances such as Microwave Ovens, Washers, Dryers; Freon-Containing Appliances such as Refrigerators, Freezers, Air Conditioners, Humidifiers.

Other Recycling Items Collected Curbside and Accepted at the Recycling Center by the Public Works Department

Items Accepted at the Recycling Center Only

- **Large Rigid Plastics** – Acceptable items are; large plastic toys, laundry baskets, soda and milk crates, plastic pet carriers, kitty litter buckets, plastic storage containers, plastic outdoor furniture without PVC pipes or metal, clean 5 gallon buckets without metal handles.
- **Electronics** – See below for requirements and accepted items.

Items Collected Curbside and Accepted at the Recycling Center

- **White Goods and Appliances** – For the curbside collection of these items a sticker must be purchased from the Health Department prior to pick up. Stickers must be purchased before 3:00pm on Thursday for Friday collection. White Goods shall include, but are not limited to; refrigerators, stoves, washing machines, dryers, air conditioners, dishwashers, etc. There is no charge for items delivered to the Recycling Center.
- **Garden Trimmings** – Consist of vegetation, twigs, brush trimmings, small branches and small plants. For curbside collection place Garden Trimmings in a marked re-usable container (30 gal. max.)
- **Brush** – (Branches) Brush is collected curbside from April thru December according to the provided schedule. Brush shall be no larger than 4" diameter and 6' long, tied in bundles and stacked neatly at the curb or delivered to the Recycling Center. (No Brush in bags)
- **Christmas Trees** – Collected curbside January 2nd – January 31st or delivered to the Recycling Center
- **Tires** - Tires can either be collected curbside or delivered to the Recycling Center. For curbside collection a sticker must be purchased from the Health Department before 3:00pm on Thursday for Friday Pick up. The cost for tire disposal is \$4.00 for curbside collection and \$3.00 for tires delivered to the Recycling Center.
- **Grass and Leaves** – Are collected April thru December in accordance with the provided schedule. For curbside collection place grass and leaves in a re-usable container (30 gal. max.) or biodegradable bags which are available at the D. P. W. (Container shall be marked Grass/Leaves)

NOTE: Curbside leaf vacuum collection will take place in all sections from October 22, 2018 thru December 14, 2018. Brush, Garden Trimmings, Grass & Leaves will be accepted at the Recycling Center from April 2, 2018 – December 21, 2018.

Electronics Recycling

The New Jersey Electronics Recycling Act mandates that as of January 1, 2011 all televisions, portable desktop or personal computers and computer monitors can no longer be disposed of in the landfill and that they be recycled. In addition to the mandated items listed above, the Recycling Center will also accept the following items at no cost;

- Desktop printers and printer / fax / copier / scanner combinations
- Computer peripherals, including keyboards, mice, hard drives, and other devices
- Fax machines; and
- DVD players, VCR's, and other video players (i.e., DVR's)

NOTE: Items that are damaged or have been stripped of their electronic components will not be accepted.
