
Who's Road is it Anyway?


- The roads in Dover are a combination of State, County, Local & Private roads
- ► Per our Graphical Information System (GIS):
 - ► County roads make up 5.140 miles
 - ► State roads make up 3.436 miles
 - ► Local roads (Dover's responsibility) make up 37.178 miles
 - ► All public roads equals 45.754 miles
- ▶ There are a small number of "Private Roads" in Dover that must be maintained by the property owner(s)









- ▶ 33 Separate Roadway Projects

- ▶ 46% of all roads under Dover's jurisdiction




\$11.8 Million in Roadway Improvements - Where Did the Money Come From?




Small Cities Grant Elligible Areas




Small Cities Eligible Areas 2012

Small Cities Eligible Areas 2016




NJDOT Local Aid Grant "Eligible" Streets



- Roadway Preservation Project
- Must Meet AASHTO Standards
- ▶ The higher the ADT the better
- ► High "Distress Level" of Road
- "Extra Points"
 - ▶ Bus Stops
 - Serves "Public Facilities" (Parks, Transit Centers, Schools, etc.)
 - Designated "Center" in State Plan

"It ain't just asphalt!" - "Pave More Streets"

- Curb
- Sidewalk replacement if required for drainage or damaged by street trees
- Sidewalks where none exist
- New/Reconstructed Drainage Inlets, Piping, etc.
- Handicap Ramps with Detectable Warning Surfaces
- Striped Crosswalks
- Driveway Repair
- Topsoil and Seeding of disturbed areas
- Traffic Control Signs
- Street Name Signs
- Milling
- Reconstruct Base where required
