## Solid Waste Notes:

- Your solid waste cans shall be placed at the curb by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day, and no earlier than 5:00 PM on the prior evening. Receptacles must be removed by 8:00 PM on collection day.
- You may place for collection a maximum of two cans or bags (30lb. max per bag or can) at the curb for pick-up, two times per week. Additional bags or cans will only be collected if a sticker has been purchased from the Town's Health Dept.
- If your pick-up day is canceled due to a holiday or inclement weather, **no make-up date** will be scheduled. However, you will be allowed to put out double on your next scheduled collection day.
- Stickers must be purchased from the Town Health Dept. prior to pick-up of furniture/bulky waste items (sofas, chairs, mattresses, etc.) These items will be picked up by the Town's Solid Waste Hauler on the day of your regular solid waste pick-up. All solid waste containers shall be furnished with a tight fitting lid.

## Recycling Notes:

- Residents whose recyclables were missed must contact the Health Department before 10:00 AM on the Monday morning following the collection day at 973-366-2200, Ext. 1120.
- The Recycling Center - located on 211 North Sussex St. - is open on Monday/Wednesday/Friday/Saturday from 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM
- Please identify which receptacles are solid waste and which are for recycling. (Stickers available upon request in the Health Dept.) Place containers at curbside by 6:00 AM. Containers shall not exceed 50lbs.
- Stickers must be purchased from the Health Dept. at Town Hall prior to the pick-up of tires and white goods (appliances). Stickers must be purchased by 3:00 PM on Thursday for Friday pick-up.

# Single-Stream Recycling



Single-stream recycling allows cans, bottles, cardboard and all other paper to be mixed together for recycling. All of these items can go into one recycling container.

**Paper** Recycle office paper, file folders, junk mail, envelopes, flyers, newspapers and inserts, magazines, catalogs, paperbacks and phone books, wrapping paper, paper bags, tissue and cookie boxes, paper towel cores, toilet tissue rolls, frozen food boxes, cartons and boxes used for milk, juice, soup, broth, etc., clean pizza boxes, 6-pack and 12-pack cartons from soda, clean paper ice cream containers. Corrugated cardboard must be flattened. (\*\*Shredded paper - see below)



**Plastic** Recycle plastic containers (bottles and non-bottles) coded 1, 2, 4, 5, 7. Plastic caps and lids larger than 3" in diameter are acceptable\*. The smallest acceptable plastic container is a 6- to 8-ounce yogurt cup\*. Containers must be empty.



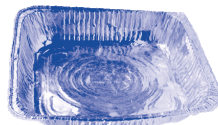
**Metal** Recycle aluminum and steel (tin) cans, loose metal jar lids, steel bottle caps, clean aluminum foil, pie plates and trays. Containers must be empty.



Do not recycle plastics coded 3 (V) and 6 (PS)



**Glass** Recycle glass bottles and jars with caps and lids removed. Recycle loose metal caps and lids. Bottles and jars must be empty.



**Residential Curbside Collection** There is a 50-pound weight limit on recycling containers. If necessary, use multiple recycling containers. Containers must have handles. Lids are strongly recommended.



All items must be empty and free of food residue.

- No liquids
- No garbage
- \* No plastic items smaller than 6- to 8-ounce yogurt cups; for example, do not recycle small plastic caps or pill bottles.
- No hangers
- No VHS/VCR tapes
- No hardcover books
- No flower pots or trays
- No window panes, mirrors, glass vases, ceramics, or Pyrex® dishware
- No stickers or address label sheet waste
- No plastics other than those listed
- No metal other than what is listed
- No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
- No paint, pesticides, oil & cleaners
- No needles/medical waste
- No plant material or food waste
- No waxed paper or waxed cardboard
- No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers
- No motor oil/anti-freeze containers
- \*\* No plastic bags other than for shredded paper
- \*\* No loose shredded paper
- \*\* Shredded paper must be in clear plastic bags. Nothing else should be in a plastic bag except for shredded paper.
- Shred only confidential information.

# Household Hazardous Wastes

Household Hazardous Wastes may be taken to Morris County MUA Facility located at 168 Goldmine Road in Flanders (Mt. Olive), NJ 07836.  
**All deliveries are by appointment only.** Call 973-829-8006 for schedules and additional information.

## Acceptable HHW

- E-Waste - Televisions, Computers, Monitors, Laptops, Printers, Fax Machines, Scanners & Audio Equipment.
- Oil-Based Paints and Varnishes, Stains, Lacquers (liquid or solidified)
- Solvents & Paint Thinners
- Propane Cylinders (BBQ sized propane cylinders cost \$5/cyl. at permanent HHW facility & there is no charge for camping stove-sized propane cyl.)
- Pesticides, Herbicides, Fertilizers
- Pool Chemicals & Chlorine
- Batteries, if they are rechargeable and/or hazardous dry-cell batteries (button-cell and lithium). Alkaline Batteries are not hazardous and are not accepted (put them into the garbage)
- Batteries for Car & Boat (Lead-Acid)
- Automotive Fluids such as Oil, Antifreeze & Brake, Transmission & Steering Fluids etc.
- Gasoline (must be transported in certified gas can)
- Automotive Cleaning Products
- Thermometers & Thermostats containing Mercury
- Fluorescent Light Bulbs and CFLs that contain Mercury
- Asbestos in small quantities, must be under 100 lbs., wet down, double bagged, sealed with duct tape, and sized to fit into 55-gallon drums.
- Kerosene
- Aerosol Cans
- Driveway Sealant & Roofing Tar if they contain coal tar or petroleum distillates.

- Adhesives
- Caulks
- Cooking Oil
- Photography Chemicals
- Nail Polish & Nail Polish Remover (Acetone)
- Muriatic Acid
- Caustic Cleaning Materials
- Fire Extinguishers



## Unacceptable HHW

- Explosives or Highly Reactive materials since these may be dangerous! Always call first for safety instructions. DO NOT bring these materials without prior authorization! These dangerous items include, but are not limited to the following
  - Picric Acid
  - Isopropyl Ether
  - Calcium Carbide
  - Perchloric Acid
  - Benzoyl Peroxide
- Materials in containers larger than 5 Gallons in size
- Dried, Hard, Solid Latex Paint or Empty Paint Cans; these are excepted for disposal at the transfer stations with other non-hazardous solid waste. Residents should remove the lids from these dried-out cans and dispose of both types into their household garbage.
- Latex or Water-Based Paints are not hazardous and are not accepted at MCMUA hazardous waste disposal programs. Latex paint may be safely disposed of in garbage when it is dried out. Dry out latex paint cans

by stirring absorbent material such as cat litter into the paint. The paint will harden within a few minutes. Leave the lid off the can, put the lid and the can into the regular garbage. A hazardous waste handling fee of \$1.25/pound is charged for latex paint. Latex paint will not be accepted whatsoever during one-day hazardous waste disposal events.

- Tires
- Smoke Detectors
- Medical Waste, including pharmaceuticals, syringes, and needles.
- Construction Materials such as Wood, Treated Lumber, Asphalt, or Concrete. Appliances such as Microwave Ovens, Washers, Dryers; Freon-Containing Appliances such as Refrigerators, Freezers, Air Conditioners, Humidifiers.

# Other Recyclable Items Collected at Curbside by the Department of Public Works and or Accepted at the Dover Recycling Center

## Items Collected Only at Curbside

- **White Goods and Appliances** – For collection of these items a sticker must be purchased from the Health Department prior to pick up. Stickers must be purchased before 3:00pm on Thursday for Friday collection. White goods shall include, but are not limited to; refrigerators, stoves, washing machines, dryers, air conditioners, dishwashers, etc.
- **Garden Trimmings** – Consist of twigs, bush trimmings, small branches and plants. Place garden trimmings in a re-usable trash can (30 gal. max.) or biodegradable bags which are available at the DPW at a cost of \$4.00/ten bags.
- **Brush** – Brush is collected April thru December according to the provided schedule. Brush shall be no larger than 4” in diameter and 6’ long, tied in bundles and stacked neatly at the curb.
- **Christmas Trees** – Collected January 4th thru January 29th.

## Items Accepted at the Recycling Center Only

- **Used Motor Oil** – Used motor oil must be collected in a reusable plastic container. (Antifreeze and any other liquids are not acceptable)
- **Car Batteries** – Car batteries shall not be leaking. (Household and rechargeable batteries are not acceptable)
- **Large Rigid Plastics** – Acceptable items are; large plastic toys, laundry baskets, soda and milk crates, plastic pet carriers, kitty litter buckets, plastic storage containers, plastic outdoor furniture without pvc pipes, clean 5 gallon buckets without metal handles.
- **Electronics** – See below for requirements and accepted items.

## Items Collected Curbside and Accepted at the Recycling Center

- **Tires** - Tires can either be collected curbside or delivered to the Recycling Center. A sticker must be purchased at the Health Department before 3:00pm on Thursday for Friday pick-up. The cost for tire disposal is \$3.00 for curbside collection and \$2.00 for tires delivered to the recycling center.
- **Grass and Leaves** - are collected April thru December in accordance with the provided schedule. Place grass and leaves in re-usable trash cans (30 gal. max) or biodegradable bags which are available at the D.P.W at a cost of \$4.00/ten bags. **(Accepted at recycling center only on Saturdays)**  
**NOTE:** Curbside leaf vacuum collection will take place in all sections from October 24, 2016 – December 2, 2016.

## Electronics Recycling

The New Jersey Electronics Recycling Act mandates that as of January 1, 2011 all televisions, portable desktop or personal computers and computer monitors can no longer be disposed of in the landfill and that they be recycled. In addition to the mandated items listed above, the Recycling Center will also accept the following items at no cost;

- Desktop printers and printer / fax / copier / scanner combinations
- Computer peripherals, including keyboards, mice, hard drives, and other devices
- Fax machines; and
- DVD players, VCR's, and other video players (i.e., DVR's)

**NOTE:** Items that are damaged or have been stripped of their electronic components will not be accepted.

### Curbside Leaf Vacuum Collection

Curbside leaf vacuum collection will take place in all sections once a week from:

**October 24, 2016 - December 2, 2016**

Note: It is illegal to place leaves in the street closer than 10 feet of any storm drain inlet. Also, don't park over piles of leaves as your cars parts are very hot and may cause a fire.
