1. There is hereby authorized to be sold by private sale pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12-13 the following portions of property, right of way or easements to the State of New Jersey, by the Commissioner of Transportation:

Parcels R 54A, R 54B, 54C and 54D, as indicated on a map entitled "New Jersey Department of Transportation, General Property Parcel Map, Route 46 (1953), Section 8, from Blackwell Street to Tabor Road, showing existing right of way and parcels to be acquired in the Town of Dover, Townships of Rockaway and Denville and Borough of Rockaway, County of Morris, June 2004."

- 2. Consideration for the transfer is as follows:
  Parcel R 54 A \$200.00; Parcel R 54 B \$1,100.00; Parcel 54C \$1,000.00 and Parcel 54 D \$3,000.00.
- 3. The Mayor and Clerk are authorized to execute a contract for the sale of such above referenced parcels for the consideration listed. The Mayor and Clerk are also authorized to execute any and all documents of transferral necessary to effectuate the terms and conditions of the sale.
- 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this within ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.
- 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.
  - 6. The Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS -**

Mayor Dodd opened the meeting to the public.

Virginia Brennan – 17 Cross Street – Questioned why the municipal building was painted, if bids were received.

Mayor Dodd responded that he has a lot of pride in our town. The municipal building was painted years ago by slap workers and also the Department of Public Works as a stop gap measure, they are not professionals. Now we have a court room that we can be proud of. Other work that has been done is a new reception desk, floors, molding. We must maintain of our own property if we enforce property maintenance for everyone else.

She also commented about not helping seniors in Town of Dover.

Mayor Dodd replied he appointed a Senior Citizens Advisory Committee which includes Aldermen Poolas, Delaney and Picciallo.

Maria Tambini – 6-16 E. Blackwell Street – Wanted to thank the board for all the services that are offered to the seniors.

Mary Jenkins – 305 S. Morris Street – Wanted to know the status of her complaint about 306 S. Morris Street always having to many cans of garbage out.

Rick Kraus – 303 S. Morris Street – spoke about the same complaint as above.

Mayor Dodd commented that their concerns were understood and Administrator Garvin will follow up with you tomorrow. He all so stated that the process has to take its course.

Robin Foster – 90 Penn Ave. – Asked the board for better enforcement in the downtown area.

Joan Bocchino – 49 Princeton Ave. – Thanked the mayor for appointing her to a board. Stated it was good to see a woman back on the board. Questioned why the Better Deal Car Lot had twenty-five cars on it and they are only allowed twelve. She also asked if trying to keep the downtown area clean would it be extend to the Route 46 Corridor.

Mayor Dodd asked how long can the former car lot which has a blue tarp on it can stay like that.

Alderman Timpani stated the cars are removed there is only one pick-up truck there.

Attorney Pennella stated it is decided on a case by case basis and involves the insurance company. He recommends checking with Bill Isselin.



Alderman Timpani raised the concern of an illegal deck on the Salvation Army Building and asked about the snow fencing around the gas station at Mt. Hope Ave.

Connie Sibona Foster – 90 Penn Ave. – Commented the speed bumps are great on N. Sussex St. and asked if any other places were earmarked to get them. She has been complaining about speeding on Penn Ave for fifteen years and radar is not consistent enough.

Alderman Timpani (Police Committee Chair) and Administrator will meet with Chief Valentine to discuss a radar initiative.

Maria Tambini -6-16 East Blackwell Street- Saw that some places were using cardboard cops at a cost of \$120.00. Stated the painting of the courtroom and library are beautiful, also about the money that was saved with the Mayor's Assistance program doing many repairs at the library.

William Hann – 9 E. Munson Ave. – Stated he sees a lot of good such as new businesses as he walks. Commented on leaves and bottles being in the park at Second Street.

Edward Correa – 80A E. Blackwell St.- Would like to know the purpose of the Historic Preservation Commission and how members were selected.

Mayor Dodd stated the purpose is to protect the history of our downtown area; Dover is designated as a historic district. They have control over store fronts, awnings, etc. Members are appointed by the mayor and I tried to select members who have knowledge of our heritage and history and also understand the need for redevelopment. He recommends a copy of the ordinance be picked up.

Emiliano Limos – 48 Second Street – Inquired about the three social affair permits for Global Reach International., he questioned the non-profit status and if we knew where the money was going.

Mayor Dodd asked Clerk Verga to respond.

Clerk Verga responded that an organization receives non-profit status from the state and they are required to submit reports to the state on where their money went. The town is not privy to the reports submitted to the state.

Seeing no hands and hearing no voices Mayor Dodd closed this portion of the meeting to the public.

Alderman Fahy asked about the status of minutes. It was explained the clerk's office has been short staffed and they will be caught up now that an employee was hired.

The mayor received an e-mail from Fred Huston informing him that Mr. Houston had film reels from the late 1800s of a baby parade. He is giving them to Alderman Poolas to hand over to the Historical Society and hopefully they can transfer to different media.

A motion was made to adjourn at 8:18pm by Alderwoman Romaine and seconded by Alderman Timpani and passed by the following voice vote. All ayes.
