The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen was held in council chambers, 37 N. Sussex Street, Dover, New Jersey.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Dodd at 7:36 pm

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

WHEREAS, The Annual Report of Audit for the year 2008 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk as per the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations" as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the promulgations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB -52- to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office."

<u>RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER GRANTING</u> PERMISSION FOR AQUA TEK TO INSTALL IN SIDEWALK RIGHT-OF-WAY MONITORING WELLS

WHEREAS, Hilltop Exxon located at 61 Route 46 West, a former gas station is required by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) to install off-site monitoring wells; and

WHEREAS, Aqua Tek Environmental Consulting, Inc. (Aqua Tek) operating under NJDEP oversight is engaged in groundwater remedial investigation; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the ongoing remedial investigation activities, Hilltop is required by the NJDEP to install offsite monitoring wells on Lincoln Avenue in the sidewalk right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Dover will require a road opening permit for the installation of the monitoring wells; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department of the Town of Dover will review the plans and approve same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris and

State of New Jersey approves the installation of off-site monitoring wells at 2 Lincoln and for the issuance of a Road Opening Permit is hereby approved subject to the following:

a. The installer must obtain a Street Opening Permit with associated performance bond and insurance certificate;

b. Construction details must be provided subject to the engineer's approval;

c. The installer is responsible for complete maintenance of the wells and sidewalk while wells are in place and until they are removed or abandoned and will remain responsible for the removal or proper abandonment of same;

d. The bond shall remain in force until such time as the wells can be removed or abandoned;

e. The amount of the bond shall be determined by the engineer.

Alderman Timpani has moved the foregoing resolution be adopted and duly seconded by Alderman Delaney and passed by the following roll call vote.

<u>Wayne Paterson</u> – Wharton Resident and Mine Hill coach. He stated he had a problem with another coach. Attorney Pennella referred him to the Recreation Commission since it was a recreation matter. Mayor Dodd said their next meeting is on Thursday, August 13th.

KAY WALKER – 72B East Blackwell Street – Ms. Walker attended the recreation trip and expressed that Alice (Recreation) does a phenomenal job. She expressed to the board that the kiosk system is a great system and noted that commuters are using the lots (lots are full). She asked if a sound system could be checked for the meeting room, she had problems hearing. Mayor Dodd expressed that currently there's a system in place and maybe some volume adjustments need to be made.

DENISE RIDNER – Dover Recreation – She thanked the Mayor, Board Aldermen and Mr. Close for all their support with the fireworks event. She noted that everyone involved did a great job. She thanked Alderwoman Blackman for standing at the entrance collecting admission fees and Alderwoman Romaine for her assistance with the Dover Day fundraising. She thanked the Dover Fire, Police and Public Works Departments and for their assistance.

<u>SANDRA SCARNEO</u> – 66 First Street – Thanked that Board and Recreation for the great fireworks. She commented that it was very difficult to hear the Mayor and Denise speak at the fireworks and she was hoping the town could fix the problem. Mayor Dodd and Denise expressed that it's a concern and they will work on a better system for next year.

ED RIDNER – He asked for an update on the installation of signs at the corner of Glenwood Avenue and Knickerbocker Avenue. Mayor Dodd apologized for the signs not being installed and noted he will request for them to be installed. He wanted to know if Van Nostrand could be made one-side of the street parking. Mayor Dodd noted that a request would need to be sent to the county and with their approval, an ordinance could be introduced.

MARIE TAMBINI – 6-16 E.Blackwell Street – Ms. Tambini commented on several signs that are faded around town. Mayor Dodd commented that DPW is touring the area for bent and/or faded signs and noted that they will be addressed. She noted several incidents (people picnicking & hanging out on cars in her driveway) with the flea market vendors. She explained that Sgt. Smith assisted her with her complaints and was very pleasant. Mayor Dodd noted that he and Mr. Close will discuss the issues with Mr. & Mrs. Brumale.

<u>CONNIE SIBONA-FOSTER</u> – 90 Penn Avenue – She commented that the fireworks were excellent and suggested fundraising buckets to be placed in businesses to help defray the cost of the fireworks. She noted that people without permits are using the fields and litter is left behind. Mayor Dodd recognizes that there's a problem and explained that Mr. Close advised him that the goal posts will be removed and placed back when a permits are issued.

Seeing no hands and hearing no voices, Mayor Dodd closed this portion of the meeting and asked for a motion to adjourn.
