CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES

June 10, 2014 7:00 PM

The Caucus Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen was held in council chambers, 37 N. Sussex Street, Dover, New Jersey.

Mayor Dodd called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Aldermen Picciallo, Romaine (7:06 pm), Blackman, Rutan, Noriega, Yzarnotegui, MacDonald and Mayor Dodd Absent: Alderman Visioli

Also present were Interim Administrator/Municipal Clerk Verga, Attorney Downs, Chief Financial Officer Kelley Toohey and representatives from Nisivoccia LLP David Evans and John Mooney.

Clerk Verga stated adequate notice was given to the official newspaper

SUNSHINE LAW STATEMENT

In accordance with the provisions set forth in the Open Public Meeting Law, notification of this meeting has been sent to all officially designated Town newspapers and notice is posted in the Town Hall.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE INTRODUCTION OF THE 2014 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

The following items were noted in Mayor Dodd's comments:

- The public hearing and adoption of the 2014 municipal budget will be held on July 8th.
- The 2014 budget will show an increase of \$8.42 or \$101 on the average home assessed at \$281,551. The difference is approximate increase of 4% which is half of what other towns in Morris County are currently paying in property taxes.
- The budget also includes a loss of \$6.8 million in ratables for 2013.
- He expressed that the town overcame some financial hurdles in 2013; for example a difficult winter which did impact the town finances. We also had the opening of King Field, which was a capital expenditure along with a grant that was given through Major League Baseball to build new baseball fields in town. The Hurd Park Pavilion was also renovated, after significant damage was incurred by Hurricane Sandy and Hurricane Irene. A portion was covered through insurance but most of it had to be paid by the town because there were additional expenditures.
- Services to the community were not impacted which Mayor Dodd believes is critical.
- He noted several items that were inserted into the budget for example a 5% down payment on a \$2 million capital project improvement throughout the town; \$1 million of it includes roadway improvements.
- He thanked everyone involved for their work with the 2013 Municipal Budget.

Mr. John Mooney from Nisivoccia LLP expressed that before the introduction of the budget, the board has to take action on two items; resolution for the self-examination of the budget and introduction of the COLA Ordinance. Mr. Mooney noted the Dover is below the expenditure CAP by approximately \$400,000 and right at the tax levy CAP. Also, mentioned was that Dover is at least \$2,000 below the state average in total tax and a \$4,000 below county average in total tax.

SELF EXAMINATION OF BUDGET RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5 the Town of Dover has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2014 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, Town of Dover, that in accordance with N.J.S.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:

- a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
- b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
- c. Cash deficit of preceding year
- d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
- e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
- f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes

2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).

3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.

4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:

- a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate, and correctly stated
- b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth

c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.

5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.

6. That all other applicable statuary requirements have been fulfilled.

ORDINANCE NO. 14-2014 CALENDAR YEAR 2014 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40a:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N,J.S.40A"4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 0.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover in the County of Morris finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2014 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby determines that a 3.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$473,388 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, in the County of Morris, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2014 budget year, the final appropriations of the Town of Dover shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$552,286 and that the CY 2014 municipal budget for the Town of Dover be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon; be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Alderwoman Romaine has moved the ordinance be adopted and duly seconded by Alderman Picciallo and passed for first reading by the following roll call vote.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Jon Sperry – 67 North Bergen Street – He requested that the town contact the state of New Jersey to retime the lights along Clinton, Morris, Sussex and Pequannock Streets because its causing traffic on Route 46 to back up. Mayor Dodd expressed that the state has been contacted. He wanted to know when the playground would be installed at the JFK Park. Mayor Dodd noted that they will have to review the budget.

Pinelopi Sikolas - 37 Elizabeth Street – She wanted to know the status of the new electric company to service the town of Dover. Mayor Dodd noted it's not a new company but a third party supplier and we are not far enough in the process to comment on it. He explained that the board voted to allow Passaic Valley do a study to see what cost savings can be provided to the residents. He noted that residents will automatically be opted-in and it would be the responsibility of the resident to opt-out.

Alderwoman Romaine expressed that she has gotten great feedback, during prom pictures, about Hurd Park and its new pavilion.
