### **ORDINANCE No. 04-2023**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS AND THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY CREATING PROHIBITED PARKING REGULATIONS FOR BEAUFORT AVENUE

WHEREAS, the governing body of a municipality make, amend, repeal, and enforce ordinances to adopt policies and procedures for the benefit of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Aldermen recognize that there is a need to make reasonable changes to the Code of the Town of Dover to prohibit on street parking from 2AM – 6AM on Beaufort Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen have determined that it is in the best interest of the town to prohibit parking from 2AM – 6AM along the northerly and southerly side of Beaufort Avenue; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

### **SECTION 1.** Definition – No Parking Zone

A "No Parking Zone" for the purpose of this ordinance shall be an area along the sideline(s) of a public street that prohibits parking 7 days a week from 2AM – 6AM.

### **SECTION 2.** Description – Location of No Parking Zone

### North Side and South Side of Beaufort Ave. Description:

Said "No Parking Zone" for the purposes of this ordinance shall be described as the area of prohibited parking for the northerly and southerly side of Beaufort Avenue beginning at the westerly curb line intersection of Ann Street and Beaufort Avenue thence continuing in a westerly direction along the curb line of the roadway for a distance of 840 feet to the westerly curb line of Rockridge Terrace.

### **SECTION 3.** Violation and Penalties

Every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this Ordinance, or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days or both.

**SECTION 4.** This ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law. This ordinance shall supersede any previous ordinance(s) that may have been adopted prior to this ordinance being adopted.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 111-2023**

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY SUPPORTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A VETERAN'S AFFAIRS (VA) CENTER IN NORTHWEST, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, Veterans in the State of New Jersey deserve high quality and accessible mental health care; and

WHEREAS, The United State has a long history of providing assistance to veterans, beginning in the colonial era; and

WHEREAS, During the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln signed a law to establish a national soldiers and sailors asylum, creating the blueprint for future VA hospitals; and

WHEREAS, In 1917, the United States Congress established a new system for veterans benefits, expanding services and providing soldiers returning from World War I with access to newly established hospitals that specifically addressed the needs of veterans; and

WHEREAS, After World War II, the population of veterans increased, leading the United States Congress to enact new benefits for veterans and to the modernization of the VA; and

WHEREAS, In 1979, the United States Congress recognized the mental health needs of veterans who had returned from Vietnam and created Vet Centers to provide mental health and readjustment services to veterans; and

WHEREAS, Vet Centers provide a broad range of counseling, outreach, and referral services to eligible veterans in order to help the veteran make a successful readjustment to civilian life; and

WHEREAS, Vet Centers provide veterans, service members, and their families with readjustment counseling including individual and group counseling, family counseling, bereavement counseling, military sexual trauma counseling and referral, and substance abuse assessment and referral, and with other medical and social services to assist veterans; and

WHEREAS, Separate from VA sites to ensure confidentiality of services and easy access to care, Vet Centers are located within the community to best serve veterans, service members, and their families; and

WHEREAS, There are currently five Vet Centers in New Jersey, none of which are located in the northwestern part of the State; and
