Dear Dover Residents and Friends,

It gives me great pleasure to present the **2022 Recycling & Solid Waste Newsletter** to you. The information in our newsletter is helpful for maintaining safety, a high quality of life for our hometown, and will ensure that we **Keep Dover Beautiful!** Following the guidelines helps us to do our part for our community and the greater good, so thank you for your contributions! Over the years, we have made many improvements to our Municipal Recycling Center, which is located at 211 North Sussex Street at the *Richard Newman Public Works Facility*. The Recycling Center is open and staffed three days per week, Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8am – 12pm, and Saturdays from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm. Staff will be on hand during all open hours to monitor and to maintain the Recycling Center. We will continue to accept *White Goods*, Appliances and Electronics at the Recycling Center **at no cost to our residents**. “White Goods” are defined as all large appliances such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, etc. whether they are actually white in color or not.

For your convenience, Brush & Garden Trimmings curbside collection will continue on its expanded schedule on Thursdays and Fridays (see schedule). Natural Christmas trees can be placed curbside daily M-F from January 3rd through January 28, 2022. Any natural garland or wreaths with wire frames must have the metal removed in order to recycle them with natural trees.

In order to keep our community safe from fraud, I am very pleased that we are again offering a paper shredding event on Saturday, May 7, 2022, as long as safety permits. If you plan to attend the event, please be sure to abide by whatever the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines are in effect at that time.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind our residents that household garbage is not permitted in the public trash containers located on Blackwell Street, violators will be issued summonses to court. Kindly dispose of your household trash curbside at your home on the appropriate day. Also, for your information, the contract with Blue Diamond, our trash and recycling contractor ends in 2022. You may see a new contractor; however, you will continue to receive trash collection services on the same days

As always, I greatly appreciate your kind support and I remain honored and humbled to serve you as your Mayor.

Solid Waste Notes:

- Your solid waste cans shall be placed at the curb by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day, and no earlier than 5:00 PM on the prior evening. Receptacles must be removed by 8:00 PM on collection day.
- You may place for collection a maximum of two cans or bags (30lb. max per bag or can) at the curb for pick-up, two times per week. Additional bags or cans will only be collected if a sticker has been purchased from the Town's Health Dept.
- If your pick-up day is canceled due to a holiday or inclement weather, **no make-up date** will be scheduled. However, you will be allowed to put out double on your next scheduled collection day.
- Stickers must be purchased from the Town Health Dept. prior to pick-up of furniture/bulky waste items (sofas, chairs, mattresses, etc.) These items will be picked up by the Town's Solid Waste Hauler on the day of your regular solid waste pick-up. **All solid waste containers shall be furnished with a tight fitting lid.**

Recycling Notes:

- Residents whose recyclables were missed must contact the Health Department before 10:00 AM on the Monday morning following the collection day at 973-366-2200, Ext. 2120.
- The Recycling Center - located at 211 North Sussex St. - is open on Tuesday/Thursdays 8 AM - 12 PM & Saturday from 8 AM to 2 PM
- Please identify which receptacles are solid waste and which are for recycling. (Stickers available upon request in the Health Dept.) Place containers at curbside by 6:00 AM. **Containers shall not exceed 30lbs, and shall have a tight fitting lid.**
- Stickers must be purchased from the Health Department prior to the pick-up of tires and white goods (appliances). Stickers must be purchased by 3:00 PM on Thursday for Friday pick-up.

MORRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY

SINGLE-STREAM all-in-one RECYCLING

The Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority "all-in-one," single-stream recycling collection program allows cans, bottles, cardboard and all other paper to be mixed together for recycling. All of these items can go into one recycling container.

Recycle office paper, file folders, junk mail, envelopes, flyers, newspapers and inserts, magazines, catalogs, paperbacks and phone books, wrapping paper, paper bags, tissue and cookie boxes, paper towel and toilet tissue cores, frozen food boxes, cartons and boxes used for milk, juice, soup, broth, etc., clean pizza boxes, 6-pack and 12-pack cartons from soda, clean paper ice cream containers. Corrugated cardboard must be flattened. (*For shredded paper preparation, see below.)

Recycle plastic containers (bottles and non-bottles) coded:

Plastic caps and lids larger than 3" in diameter are acceptable. The smallest acceptable plastic container is an 8-ounce yogurt cup. Containers must be empty.

Recycle aluminum and steel (tin) cans, loose metal jar lids, steel bottle caps, clean aluminum foil, pie plates and trays.

Recycle glass bottles and jars with caps and lids removed. Recycle loose metal caps and lids. Bottles and jars must be empty.

IMPORTANT

*Recycling containers must not exceed 30 pounds. 32-gallon containers are recommended.

*Only use plastic bags for shredded paper. All other material must be loose in a container, not in a bag.

*Do not tie cardboard or newspapers, put in reusable containers loose, or stack folded boxes into one box.

*Label your recycling containers with free decals from your town or the MCMUA.

*If necessary, use multiple recycling containers. Containers must have handles. Lids are strongly recommended.

All items must be empty, dry, and free of food residue.

No liquids

No cups

No plastic items smaller than 8-ounce yogurt cups; for example, do not recycle small plastic caps or pill bottles

No VHS/VCR tapes

No hangers

No hardcover books

No flower pots or trays

No plant material or food waste

No window panes, mirrors, glass vases, ceramics, or Pyrex® dishware

No glass, plastics or metal other than what is listed

No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)

No paint, pesticides, oil and cleaners

No waxed paper

No waxed cardboard

No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers

No stickers or address label sheet waste

No spray pumps or nozzles

No straws

No motor oil, gas or anti-freeze containers

No clothing, textiles, or shoes

No insulated box liners

No hoses

No diapers

No garbage

Do not tie newspapers or cardboard

*No loose shredded paper

No plastic bags other than for shredded paper

*Shredded paper must be in clear plastic bags. Nothing else should be in a plastic bag except for shredded paper. Shred only confidential information.

Oil-Based Paints and Stains

Paint Thinners and Solvents

Morris County MUA Operates Year-round HHW Facility

In an effort to make managing household hazardous waste ("HHW") more convenient for Morris County residents, the MCMUA has a permanent HHW facility that allows both residents and businesses to dispose of hazardous materials throughout the year.

The HHW facility is open by appointment on most Tuesday, Friday and Saturday mornings. Eligible businesses will be charged a \$1.25/lb. disposal fee.

Some Problems Caused by Improper HHW Disposal . . .

In the Home: Risks to children, pets, and homeowners if used or stored improperly.

Chemical Incompatibility: Chlorine bleach and ammonia form a deadly gas; other combined materials may react causing fumes, fires, or explosions.

Poured Down the Drain: May ruin septic fields, pollute groundwater, pass through municipal systems to surface waters.

In refuse: May injure garbage workers, damage containers or vehicles.

May contribute to **groundwater contamination** from municipal landfills.

May contribute to the **toxicity of ash and air emissions** from municipal incinerators.



Reduce wastes: use up leftovers.

Thrown in the trash, down the drain or on the ground, leftover household chemicals can contaminate our air, water and land. The best way to avoid the problem is not to produce a waste at all. Store leftover chemicals for another project and use them up! Or, give them to others to use up. A clean environment is up to you!

Household Hazardous Waste: You can make a difference!

Unacceptable Materials:

Medical Waste

Latex (Water-based) Products: These should be dried out and disposed of with the trash.

Empty Containers: Once a container is empty, it can be recycled or disposed of in the normal manner.

Unknown Materials: If unlabeled or unidentifiable, the waste may not be acceptable.

Business Waste: This program is primarily for household hazardous waste. Eligible business waste will be accepted at the HHW Facility only with prior notification. Businesses should schedule an appointment with the MCMUA by calling (973) 631-5109.

Morris County MUA Continues to Sponsor HHW Disposal Events

The Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Program is designed to provide Morris County residents with an environmentally-sound way of recycling or disposing of hazardous materials found in and around the home.

Disposal days are offered throughout the year at different locations to assist homeowners with a safe way to recycle or dispose of hazardous materials. If you would like more information on the specific dates and locations of the disposal events, please contact the MCMUA at (973) 829-8006.

Steps that we all can take to help prevent litter, garbage and recycling from collecting on our streets of Dover

- Make sure that all recycling and garbage cans are secured with a tight fitting lid.
- If birds or other animals are constantly tearing your garbage bags open, switch to a solid can with a tight fitting lid.
- Properly secure all cans when strong winds are predicted.
- Please remove your recycling and garbage can(s) from the curb prior to 8pm on the day of collection.
- Don't use plastic bags for recycling (exception: shredded paper must be in a clear plastic bag). Recycling placed in plastic bags will be rejected at the curb.
- The receptacles that are placed in our parks and public streets are not for household garbage. Please dispose of household garbage in cans or bag on the day of garbage collection.
- Don't throw litter or garbage onto the public sidewalks or streets, use the municipal containers.
- Please recycle.
- Pick up any litter, garbage or recyclables you see while walking through the town.

Other Recycling Items Collected Curbside and Accepted at the Recycling Center by the Public Works Department

Items Accepted at the Recycling Center Only

- **Large Rigid Plastics** – Acceptable items are; large plastic toys, laundry baskets, soda and milk crates, plastic pet carriers, kitty litter buckets, plastic storage containers, plastic outdoor furniture without PVC pipes or metal, clean 5 gallon buckets without metal handles.
- **Electronics** – See below for requirements and accepted items.

Items Collected Curbside Only

- **Garden Trimmings** – Consist of vegetation, twigs, brush trimmings, small branches and small plants. For curbside collection place Garden Trimmings in a marked re-usable container (30 gal. max.)
- **Brush** – (Branches) Brush is collected curbside from April thru December according to the provided schedule. Brush shall be no larger than 4" diameter and 6' long, tied in bundles and stacked neatly at the curb.
- **Christmas Trees** – Collected curbside January 3rd – January 28th
- **Grass and Leaves** – Are collected April thru December in accordance with the provided schedule. For curbside collection place grass and leaves in a re-usable container (30 gal. max.) or biodegradable bags which are available at the D. P. W. (Container shall be marked Grass/Leaves)

NOTE: See schedule for leaf vacuum collection.

Items Collected Curbside and Accepted at the Recycling Center

- **White Goods and Appliances** – For the curbside collection of these items a sticker must be purchased from the Health Department prior to pick up. Stickers must be purchased before 3:00pm on Thursday for Friday collection. White Goods shall include, but are not limited to; refrigerators, stoves, washing machines, dryers, air conditioners, dishwashers, etc. There is no charge for items delivered to the Recycling Center.
- **Tires** - Tires can either be collected curbside or delivered to the Recycling Center. For curbside collection a sticker must be purchased from the Health Department before 3:00pm on Thursday for Friday Pick up.

Electronics Recycling

The New Jersey Electronics Recycling Act mandates that as of January 1, 2011 all televisions, portable desktop or personal computers and computer monitors can no longer be disposed of in the landfill and that they be recycled. In addition to the mandated items listed above, the Recycling Center will also accept the following items at no cost;

- Desktop printers and printer / fax / copier / scanner combinations
- Computer peripherals, including keyboards, mice, hard drives, and other devices
- Fax machines; and
- DVD players, VCR's, and other video players (i.e., DVR's)

NOTE: Items that are damaged or have been stripped of their electronic components will not be accepted.
