ORDINANCE NO. 05-2013

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING ARTICLE XXVII OF THE REVISED GENERAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF DOVER ENTITLED "PARKING" HANDICAPPED PARKING "SPACES" BY REPEALING HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACE AT 121 BAKER STREET

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. The following location which was designated as a Handicapped parking space by Ordinance No. 07-2000 is hereby repealed:

HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACE FOR 121 BAKER STREET

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE NO. 06-2013 OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF DOVER, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING REVISED ORDINANCES 1969 ENTITLED "PARKING, TITLE 28, SAVED FROM REPEAL", PEQUANNOCK STREET

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Dover, County of Morris and State of New Jersey as follows:

Title 28 of the Revised Ordinances 1969 of the Town of Dover Saved from Repeal under the Code of the Town of Dover is hereby supplemented and amended as follows:

(1) <u>Creation of Two (2) Hour Parking Zone.</u> Certain parts of Pequannock Street described in this subsection are designated as "Two (2) hour parking limit" zones where parking is prohibited for more than two (2) hours, specifically described as:

Along Pequannock Street (northbound and southbound) – Beginning at the northerly curb line extension West and East Clinton Streets and extending northerly one block to the southerly curb line extension of West McFarlan Street (Route 46).

(2) <u>Signage</u>. The Public Works Department is hereby authorized to post signs of the Two (2) Hour Parking zones consistent with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devises for Streets and Highways for the State of New Jersey.

(3) <u>Penalties.</u> The penalty for violation of this Ordinance shall take effect upon the publication and after second reading and approval by the Municipal Engineer and Commissioner of Transportation as required by law.

(4) <u>Repealer</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this within ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

(5) <u>Validity</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not effect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

(6) Effective Date. The Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the law.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S-2364 and Assembly Bill A3553 propose to create a system of early voting in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the goal of accommodating voters in pursuit of greater participation in the democratic process is a worthy goal; and

WHEREAS, these bills would in reality increase workloads, add more costs to the election process, and ultimately serve to confuse voters more than it would accommodate their needs; and

WHEREAS, these bills would require for each primary and general election a public facility, except a public school, located in each municipality in an area of a high concentration of population to be open and available to registered voters starting 15 days before an election for early polling, possibly conflicting with if not pushing out other important uses for these buildings, causing inconvenience to residents; and

WHEREAS, these bills require retraining of poll workers and dramatically increased hours, as well as chain of custody requirements to protect the voting process, despite the fact that recruiting and training polls workers is already a difficult process; and

WHEREAS, these bills would increase costs to municipalities, including overtime pay for workers; and

WHEREAS, although these bills allow municipalities to request reimbursement for extra costs and provide an appropriation, the appropriation does not outline a specific amount nor dedicated funding, only that which the State Treasurer and the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting deem necessary, and they do not outline the procedure for a municipality whose reimbursement request is denied; and

WHEREAS, the opportunity for "Early Voting" already exists in the State of New Jersey through the Vote by Mail ballot process.
